## **Evaluation**

Structure: The information should be organised in a clear and logical structure with attention to the following:

- Title: should attract the reader's interest and give some idea of the topic.
- Opening sentence: There should be a link between the title and the opening sentence. It should introduce the topic and make the reader want to continue.
- Paragraphing: Each new point should start a new paragraph.

Language and style: there are no or few errors of grammar and vocabulary.

The style should be light-hearted as this is an article for the school website.

The facts: the article should include information from at least three siles. It

- Level: upper-intermediate
- Age: teenagers (10-th Grade)
